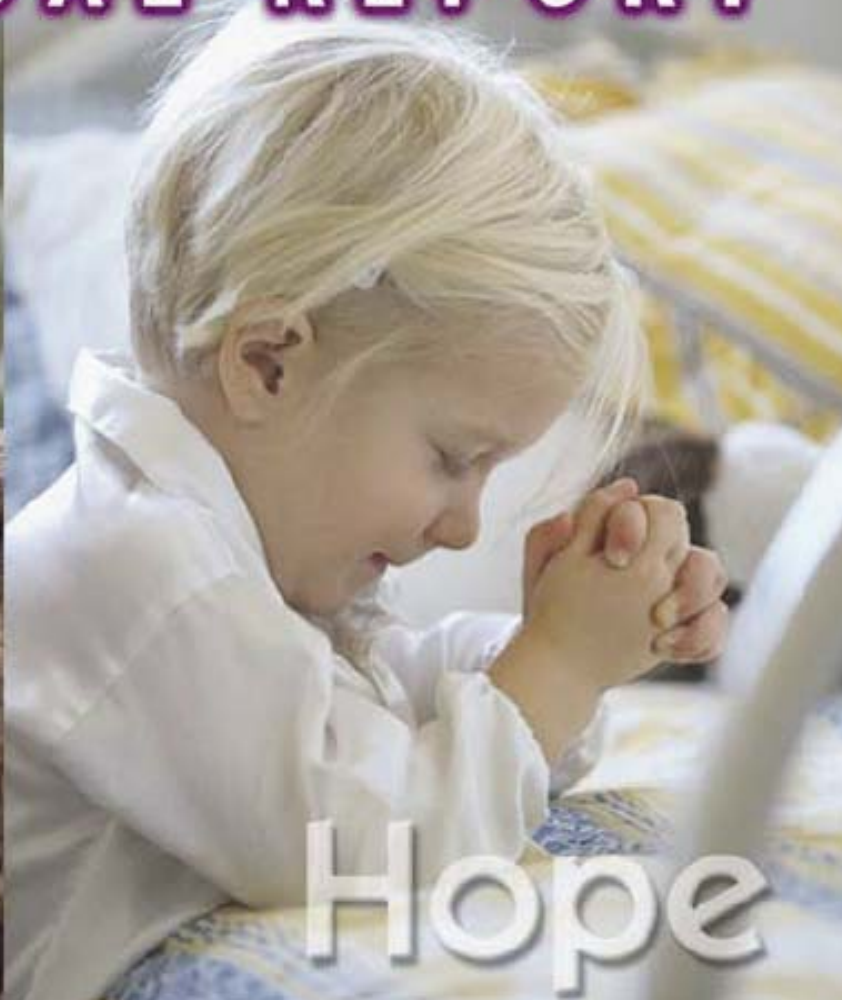

# Eliminating HUNGER



“Cathy is a single mother with three daughters under the age of 12. In order to make ends meet, she would visit one of LSS’ food pantries. Cathy always wanted to get her GED to help better her life and the lives of her daughters. With food and emotional support from LSS pantry staff, she was

able to concentrate and devote time to her studies. After not visiting the pantry for a few weeks, Cathy stopped by to tell the staff she had earned her GED. She was very proud of her accomplishment and what it means to her family.”

## The Community Kitchen at Faith Mission

Since 1966, the Community Kitchen at Faith Mission has offered hope to people devastated by hunger. Located in the men’s shelter on 6<sup>th</sup> Street, the kitchen serves three full-course meals each day to anyone who is hungry. In Fiscal Year 2006, the Community Kitchen served more than 273,000 meals.

## LSS Food Pantries

LSS food pantries served more than \$2.8 million worth of food for over one million meals in Fiscal Year 2006. They also provided nearly 3,000 Thanksgiving meals to low-income families. In order to supply food to so many people in need, the food pantries must rely on their hundreds of volunteers. In Fiscal Year 2006 more than 28,000 volunteer hours were logged at the five pantries.

Work also began to convert all pantries to the “Choice Food Pantry Model.” This model is organized similarly to a supermarket and allows clients to select their own food. The Choice Food Pantry Model helps to build self-esteem and provides dignity to those who are in need.



# Providing HOUSING

*“As a result of his drug and alcohol use, John was unable to work and soon became homeless. With nowhere else to turn, he arrived at our emergency shelter. While at the shelter, John completed drug and alcohol treatment and received help from our case managers to develop a résumé and sharpen his job interview skills. John now regularly attends AA meetings in the area and even sponsors new members. He has maintained full-time employment since leaving the shelter and is planning to start his own business. In addition, John has maintained permanent housing for more than a year. John is an active volunteer at the emergency shelter and provides free haircuts to residents on a monthly basis. He recently was asked by the city of Lancaster to be the keynote speaker at a local celebration.”*



## Faith Mission

Last year, more than 8,700 men and women found support for reshaping their lives and establishing a permanent home through the programs and services of Faith Mission. Services include temporary shelter, job search assistance and access to medical, mental health and addiction treatment services. In addition, Faith Mission provided more than 102,000 nights of shelter in Fiscal Year 2006.

## Affordable Housing

In February, LSS broke ground on North Community Place, our 18<sup>th</sup> affordable housing community. This new facility will feature a library, exercise room, arts and crafts studio, and a coin operated laundry room.

In Fiscal Year 2006 our affordable housing communities provided a comfortable living environment to 979 seniors. Each resident's rent is calculated based on his or her specific financial situation. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development then pays the remainder, allowing low-income seniors the chance to live in a safe and friendly atmosphere.



# Promoting HEALING



“ When Mr. and Mrs. Harrison moved into Kensington Place, they didn't think they would need the nursing facilities at The Care Center in the immediate future. Unfortunately, Mr. Harrison was taken to the hospital the next day and diagnosed with cancer. After his release from the hospital, Mr.

Harrison was admitted to The Care Center's skilled rehabilitation unit. Mrs. Harrison and their family were able to visit Mr. Harrison every day. Soon he was able to move back into their apartment at Kensington Place. With the help and support of the Lutheran Village staff, the Harrisons are informed and prepared to make the decisions facing them in the future as Mr. Harrison's care needs change. ”

## Faith Mission Clinic

Faith Mission is the only Columbus shelter that offers free, on-site medical, dental and vision care for residents. The mission partners with Healthcare for the Homeless and The Ohio State University to provide the services. In Fiscal Year 2006, the Clinic provided care to more than 4,000 people in need.

## Skilled Nursing Facilities

For more than forty years, Lutheran Village of Columbus (LVC) has been dedicated to providing an optimal level of independence within a caring, respectful environment for those needing nursing care.

The Good Shepherd Rehabilitation and Healthcare Campus, established in Ashland, Ohio in 1956, specializes in comprehensive rehabilitative services and complex and skilled nursing programs.

In Fiscal Year 2006, Lutheran Village of Columbus, Lutheran Village of Ashland and The Good Shepherd provided more than 155,000 days of care.



# Inspiring HOPE

*“ Mary and her husband live in southeast Ohio and are raising their two grandchildren. They have farmed all of their lives but, recently, have fallen on hard times. Mary relies on the Southeast Ohio Ministries’ (SEOM) distribution center to help make ends meet. Last Christmas, Mary and her husband could only afford one new pair of shoes for each child. Mary wrapped each shoe individually, so the children would have more than one gift to open. After hearing of Mary’s situation, SEOM was able to provide new toys for the children to open on Christmas morning. Additionally, SEOM made sure the children had school clothes and supplies for the upcoming school year. ”*



## Southeast Ohio Ministries

Southeast Ohio Ministries (SEOM) opened a new distribution center in Caldwell, Ohio in Fiscal Year 2006. With the additional space, SEOM will be able to serve more people through the following areas: the Dental Health Education Program, the Servant Event/Volunteer program for youth and adults and the Disaster Response Program. With your generous support, SEOM served more than 20,000 people and completed the rebuilding of 2,300 homes in Fiscal Year 2006.

## Adoptions

LSS adoption programs united 33 children with loving, permanent families in Fiscal Year 2006. Through our International Adoptions Service, 18 children from the countries of China, Guatemala, India, Russia, Ethiopia, Colombia and Taiwan were placed with new families.

In the Birthparent Counseling program, birth parents are assisted in making good decisions for themselves and their unborn child. We support them in exploring parenting their child themselves, or considering adoption as an option.



# Program Descriptions

## **Affordable Housing**

We provide 17 affordable housing communities throughout Ohio to serve the needs of people who meet income, age or disability requirements. These communities provide residents with dignity, safety and a caring environment. Many of our sites have Service Coordinators available to link residents with services allowing them to maintain their independence.

## **Disaster Response**

Our staff and volunteers serve people affected by disasters, acting as the state-wide coordinating body for Lutheran Disaster Response. Trained responders provide material and emotional support, debris removal, case management and referral to other emergency assistance programs.

## **Family Services**

### ***Adoptions***

Since 1969, LSS has united hundreds of children with loving families by compassionately assisting prospective adoptive parents with domestic and international adoption services.

### ***Counseling***

LSS' licensed counselors and therapists offer individuals, couples and families the opportunity to address personal concerns in a private and professional setting. LSS also offers specialized programs that address domestic violence and violence prevention.

## **Food Pantries**

LSS' five food pantries serve the needs of thousands of people year-round. Hungry families and individuals receive food as well as health care screenings, back-to-school supplies and other services.

Since 2002, we have provided low-income residents of Youngstown and its surrounding areas with services including community case management and youth empowerment programs.

## **Shelters**

Homeless men and women can find shelter, food, free health care and clothing at three Columbus-area shelters and one in Fairfield County. They also receive help with housing, employment and counseling so they can rebuild their lives.

## **Southeast Ohio Ministries**

Southeast Ohio Ministries serves Appalachian communities by offering spiritual, material and financial support. Distribution of material goods, case management and dental health programs all serve to enhance the lives of those in 23 southeastern Ohio counties.

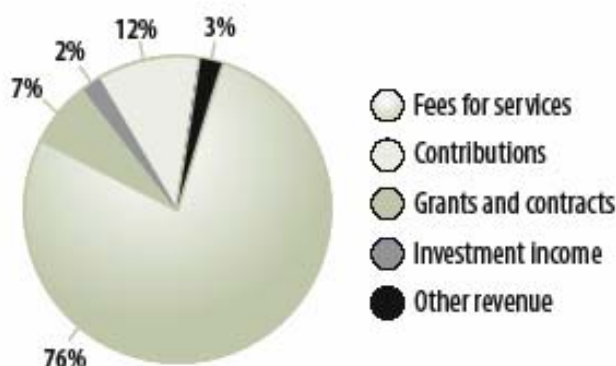

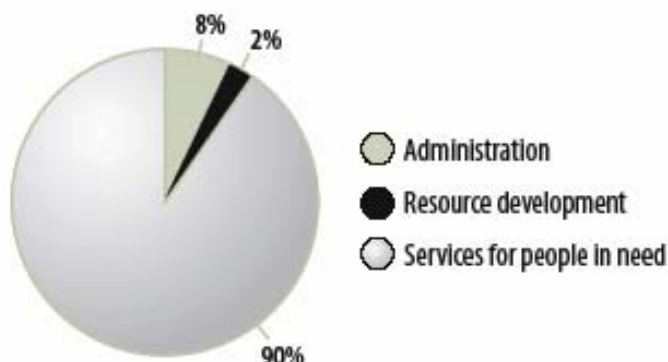

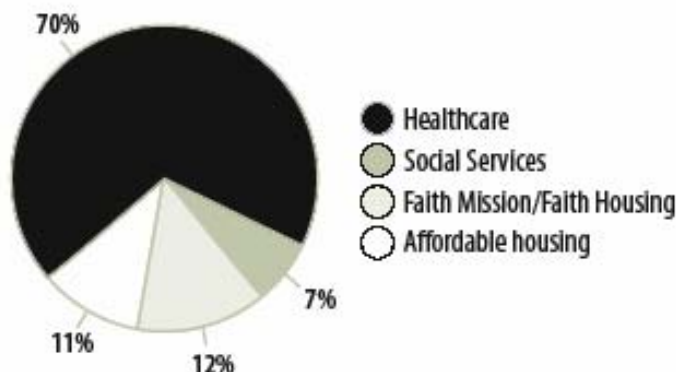
